Setting the Stage – The Red Devils travel to Allentown for a showdown with unbeaten Muhlenberg this weekend. The Mules have posted four shutouts on the season to improve to 7-0 and 5-0 in the Centennial Conference. The Red Devils are 6-1 overall and 4-1 in the CC. The Devils topped the Mules 24-14 last season, snapping a seven-year streak by the Mules in the series.

The Mules are the top team in the conference in scoring defense with the Devils close behind in third. Muhlenberg also holds the top spot in rushing, passing and total defense. Both teams lead the league in turnover margin at (+8).

Last Week - Dickinson blew the game open in the third quarter at Gettysburg. Ryan Heinig blocked a punt and Mike Dalton recovered it in the endzone to trigger three unanswered touchdowns for the Devils.

Chris McInerney returned the next punt 51 yards for a touchdown, then Heinig picked-off a pass on the Bullets first play of the ensuing drive. Ian Mitchell scored three players later as the Devils stretched a 14-13 lead to 35-13 in less than three minutes.

McInerney caught 10 passes for 88 yards and another touchdown as he became the school's all-time reception leader. He was named the CC Special Teams Player of the Week, accumulating 191 all-purpose yards.

Senior Eric Dube had another monster outing, recording a game-high 15 tackles, including nine solos and a forced fumble. He set the school record for career tackles with 345 and ranks second all-time with 45.5 tackles for loss.

Muhlenberg rolled over F&M 31-0 for its fourth shutout of the season, and eighth straight win, dating back to 2006. John DeLuca rushed for 188 yards marking his fourth straight, 100-yard game.

Last Year - The Red Devils did all their scoring in the first half behind three, first quarter touchdowns and a field-goal in the second. Michael D'Amico was just shy of the century mark with 95 yards. He also caught four passes for 57 yards and scored the Devils' first touchdown. Then wide receiver, Ian Mitchell, threw a 55 yard TD pass to Ryan Stearrett and Matt Torchia threw his second scoring pass of the day to Scott Dominick.

The Devil defense stopped Muhlenberg three times inside the 10-yard line. Andrew Ackley stalled the Mules' final drive with his second interception of the game. Eric Dube led the defense with 12 tackles while Michael O'Donnell tallied seven.

The Breaux Report

Dickinson head coach **Darwin Breaux** (West Chester, '77) holds a 93-57-1 record in his 15th season at the helm of the Red Devil football program. He has one of the highest winning percentages in the history of the program and holds the record for most wins by a Dickinson football coach.

Dickinson has won four Centennial Conference titles and made four post-season appearances under Breaux's direction. His 1994 team set a school record with the college's only 10-0 season, earning him AFCA (American Football Coaches Association) South Region Coach of the Year honors.

Breaux's teams have always been known for a traditionally strong option-oriented running game and hard hitting defense. The Red Devils have balanced the attack, setting school records for passing yards in a season the past three years.

Today's Game

The Series - Today's game marks the 63rd meeting in the series with Muhlenberg holding a 36-24-1 advantage. The Devils snapped a seven-game Mule streak with a 24-14 win last season. The teams first met in 1923 and played their conference opener against one another for the first 24 seasons of the Centennial.

Offense - Chris McInerney became the school's all-time leader in receptions with his 109th career catch on Saturday. He added eight more on the day to finish with 117. He ranks seventh in receiving yards with 1,317 in his career. He ranks second in the CC this season with 50 catches, ranking him second on the school's single season list.

Sophomore quarterback Ian Mitchell has enjoyed throwing to the sure-handed receiver this fall. He has attempted 84 consecutive passes without an interception, having thrown just one this season. He is the top rushing QB in the CC, ranking fifth overall with 577 yards.

Mitchell has completed 60 percent of his passes for 962 yards, ranking fourth in passing efficiency.

Tim Smith covered 70 yards on 10 carries against Gettysburg. Tim Wells averaged over seven yards per carry as well, finishing with 36 yards on five carries, also scoring a touchdown.

Defense - Senior Eric Dube had another monster performance on Saturday, recording a game-high 15 tackles, including nine solos and a forced fumble. He became the school's all-time leading tackler with 345 career stops. He ranks second in tackles-for-loss with 45.5.

Michael O'Donnell added 12 tackles, making 10 solo stops with 3.5 for losses. First-year Pat McNeal added seven tackles, mostly on special teams. Steve Bokron and Ben Hargrave each tallied seven tackles as well. Bokron also had 1.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

Heinig was a key both on defense and special teams. He blocked a punt that was recovered for a touchdown and intercepted a pass, helping the Devils score 21 points in under three minutes. He added a pair of pass break-ups as well.

Special Teams - Special teams played a huge roll on Saturday, blowing the game open in the third quarter. In addition to Heinig's punt block, Chris McInerney returned a punt 51 yards for a touchdown. He ranks second all-time with 69 returns for 595 yards. He also has 39 kick-off returns for 912 yards in his career.

Senior Aren Johnson broke the school mark for punting yardage. He ranks second in attempts with 196 for a school record 6,987 total yards. He is currently third in punting average at 35.7.

First-year Gordon Craig had the distance, but clipped the upright on a 42-yard field-goal attempt. He was, however, true on all six extra-points.
