Setting the Stage – The Red Devils jumped out to a 35-7 lead and went on to beat Ursinus 35-20 in the regular season finale last weekend. Dickinson claimed sole possession of second place in the Centennial Conference. They host Waynesburg University in the ECAC Southeast Bowl Game. The Yellow Jackets have an 8-2 record as well and finished 5-1 in the President's Athletic Conference. The Red Devils make their sixth appearance in the ECAC Bowl Series. Waynesburg is making its second appearance in the ECAC's in the last four years, and their third post season appearance in the past five seasons.

The Breaux Report

Dickinson head coach **Darwin Breaux (West Chester, '77)** holds a 95-58-1 record in his 15th season at the helm of the Red Devil football program. He has one of the highest winning percentages in the history of the program and holds the record for most wins by a Dickinson football coach.

Dickinson has won four Centennial Conference titles and made four post-season appearances under Breaux's direction. His 1994 team set a school record with the college's only 10-0 season, earning him AFCA (American Football Coaches Association) South Region Coach of the Year honors.

Breaux's teams have always been known for a traditionally strong option-oriented running game and hard hitting defense. The Red Devils have balanced the attack, setting school records for passing yards in a season the past three years.

Scouting Dickinson - The Red Devils stormed out of the gate and won big over Ursinus in the regular season finale. Sophomore quarterback Ian Mitchell rushed for 126 yards and threw for 82 yards and two touchdowns. He scored once on the ground as well to put the Devils in front 35-7 early in the third quarter. Mitchell broke the school record for total offense with 2,213 yards this season. He suffered a shoulder injury against Ursinus and will not be dressed on Saturday.

Chris McInerney earned first-team All-CC honors again this fall as a wide receiver and second-team honors as a kick returner. He set the school single season marks for receptions and receiving yards with 68 catches for 699. He also broke the school career record for receptions with 135. He is 14th in the nation for catches per game.

Sophomore Patrick O'Connor has also proven to be a dangerous threat with 37 catches for 565 yards and six touchdowns this season.

First-year Tim Smith and sophomore Tim Wells have joined Mitchell to do most of the damage on the ground. Smith has ran for over 500 yards while Wells averages 4.3 yards per carry and has a team-best eight touchdowns.

Senior Mike D'Amico appeared to be at full strength last weekend, rushing for a game and season-high 127 yards and two touchdowns.

Senior offensive lineman Erik Frain was named first-team All-CC this season. He helped the Red Devils rank second in the conference in rushing and sacks against, and third in total and scoring offense. The Devils are currently fifth in the nation in pass protection, allowing just 12 sacks.

Senior co-captain Eric Dube became the first player to earn back-to-back Defensive Player of the Year honors in the Centennial Conference. Dube broke school records for single season tackles with 132 this fall. He also set school marks for career tackles (379), solo tackles (180) and tackles-for-loss with 50.5. Dube leads the CC in tackles this season and ranks 14th in the nation, averaging 13.2 per game.

Classmate Eric Hertrich earned his second straight selection to the All-CC first-team. The defensive end drew a lot of attention and a lot of double-teams this fall. He still tallied 34 tackles (21 solo), 8.5 tackles-for-loss and six sacks.

Ryan Heinig and co-captain Mike O'Donnell were named second-team All-CC on defense while senior punter Aren Johnson was honorable mention.

Heinig and O'Donnell rank first and third in the CC in passes defended. Sophomore Mike Maxwell is tied for the top spot in interceptions with five this fall.

Ben Hargrave and Will Scott are second on the team in tackles with 84 and 62, respectively. Scott has an 86 yard fumble return for a score this season and two interceptions for 73 yards.

The Red Devils ranked second in rushing defense and turnover margin and third in scoring defense in the conference.

Scouting Waynesburg - The Yellow Jackets closed out the regular season with a big win as well, routing Westminster 54-13. Rookie running back Robert Heller has had an outstanding season. He ran for a school record 312 yards and five touchdowns against Westminster.

Heller is the nation's leading rusher and scorer, running for 2,019 yards in his first 10 collegiate games. He ranks second in the nation in all-purpose yards as well, averaging 215.9 yards per game.

Heller matched his school record, scoring five touchdowns to raise his season total to 27.

As a team the Yellow Jackets rank 15th in the nation in rushing offense, averaging 259.1 yards per contest.

Junior Andy Lauterbach and freshman Kyle Kyper have both seen significant time behind center this season, combining for just under 2,000 yards passing.

Ray Hightower, II is the top receiver for the Yellow Jackets. He has 19 catches on the year for over 400 yards, averaging 21.4 yards per catch in his rookie campaign.

Senior fullback Aaron Davis was a first-team All-Conference selection on offense. He was second on the team in rushing with 193 yards, averaging 4.3 per game.

The Yellow Jacket defense ranks fourth in Division III in total defense, coming in at number five in both rushing defense and sacks this season. Leading the way is PAC Player of the Year Mike Czerwien. The senior defensive end leads the nation in sacks and tackles-for-loss, averaging more than two sacks and three TFL per game.

Czerwien earned first-team All-PAC honors in each of the last four seasons. He finished with a career-best 79 tackles in the year.

Junior D.J. Dewitt also ranks in the top 25 for sacks and tackles-for-loss, averaging well over one per game. He joined Czerwien on the PAC first-team as did linebacker Brendon Steele and defensive backs Ryan Krull and Stefon Strothers.

Overall the Yellow Jackets placed seven players on the PAC first-team this season. Sophomore offensive lineman Jared Bussard was a second-team selection while seven other Yellow Jackets received honorable mention.

Waynesburg started the season 7-0 before suffering a heartbreaking 22-21 loss to Washington & Jefferson in what was essentially the PAC title game. The suffered a 24-17 overtime loss to Geneva College before regrouping for the season finale against Westminster.
